Location Description: This is a proposal by Google to construct a large mixed-use (office, residential, retail, and other uses) project in the vicinity of Diridon Station, which is served by Caltrain, Altamont Corridor Express, and Amtrak Capitol Corridor trains. The tracks through Diridon Station are also used by a small number of Union Pacific Railroad trains, and UPRR owns a segment of track that runs through the project site and another that runs along the site's northern border; both of these connect to UPRR's Milpitas yard.

Where the UPRR tracks pass through the project site, there is only a single at-grade street crossing. The project applicant will likely have to undertake some sort of improvements to allow for adequate emergency vehicle access, depending on what is ultimately proposed.

This is described in the project description of the Draft Environmental Impact Report (Draft EIR).
