Hi Pamela,

Thanks for reaching out!

You're right that the Downtown West Design Guideline and Standards designate childcare as an Active Use along with retail, restaurant, arts, cultural, live entertainment, institutional, maker spaces, non-profit, and small-format office space. Active Uses can account for up to 500,000 GSF.

It also allows a childcare facility or daycare in blocks H2 or H3, which are residential blocks.

Unfortunately, I don't have a full answer for you right now. The Design Guidelines are a guide for future development and nothing is written in stone for the type of active use in each space. If approved, this project will be built in phases starting in 2021 and ending in 2031. So it's hard to plan for the specifics needs for the area this far in advance.

As proposed, Google will build and design the space and the City of San Jose's Planning Director would review the plans and determine if it meets the Conformance Review Checklist. The operation and use of the daycares are not planned right now, but will become clearer 1) if the project is approved and 2) if a day care is proposed.

Let me know if you have any other questions or if I can clarify anything else for you.
