- Kevin Christman very angry about deluge of information, HSR; mentioned the issue that angered him most, which is the notion of a community center
- Ed Saum also annoyed about length of presentation. Picked apart amount of land for parks. Park funding always cut. City proposing to underserve significantly.
- Sondra Weber, Plant 51. Concerned about public art section and street network also. -Likes notion of San Fernando bike/ped. Thinks that we need to think about auto access more specifically. There is already bottlenecking here.
 - Jess: there are many design options that we will take up with Plant
