#### Dear Friends:

First and foremost, we want to send our best wishes to each of you, along with our hope that you, your families and friends are staying safe during these very challenging times.

Everyone at Sharks Sports & Entertainment (SSE) and SAP Center at San Jose continues to shelter in place as directed. The arena, along with all Sharks Ice facilities, remain closed during this time.

We look forward to seeing all of you again soon.

As requested, we are passing along the latest updates regarding the planned developments for the Diridon area of downtown San Jose, which surrounds SAP Center.

On April 14, the City of San Jose announced that several project updates would be delayed due to the coronavirus pandemic, including:

- The City Council's consideration of Google's Downtown West mixed-use plan has been postponed from the end of 2020 to early 2021.
- The release of the city's draft amendments to the Diridon Station Area Plan (DSAP) are now expected in fall 2020. Revisions to the DSAP will include Google's proposed project and the extension of BART to downtown San Jose.
- The draft Environmental Impact Report (EIR), along with the full development plan for Google's project (which was expected in April), will likely not be released until mid-summer.

As part of these announcements, the City of San Jose has launched a website, titled <u>Planning for the Diridon Station Area</u>. This website includes video presentations outlining potential modifications to the Diridon region in three key areas, including <u>transportation</u>.

This presentation has increased SSE's concerns in relation to the city's commitment to the future sustainability of SAP Center, including:

- Reduction of the street capacity surrounding SAP Center, including the <u>potential</u> <u>closure of the northbound Highway 87 off-ramp at Santa Clara Street</u>. This off-ramp provides direct access to a majority of the arena's parking locations and is critical to the building's continued success.
- A disproportionate emphasis on pedestrians, bicycles and mass transit in the
  downtown core. This will severely limit the ability of downtown employees, transit
  riders intending to reach Diridon Station and SAP Center guests trying to arrive and
  depart the area by automobile when most will have few, if any, other options for the
  foreseeable future.
- The continued absence of a comprehensive plan to address the substantial parking needed for the expansion of Diridon Station, the addition of BART, and SAP Center's guests. These shortfalls, coupled with Google's development proposal (which is anticipated to include a Transportation Demand Management plan that calls for a substantially reduced parking supply), will leave parking resources in the Diridon area severely impacted.

Be assured, we will continue to communicate our concerns to local leaders and project planners over the next several months.

As part of last week's announcement, the City of San Jose reaffirmed its commitment to engage with and listen to community members on the Diridon area projects. To solicit feedback from local businesses and constituents, a public survey has been created.

If you are interested in sharing your thoughts with city staff on the planned developments, you can access the survey <u>here</u>.

We understand that, as regular guests of SAP Center, you want to ensure that the facility remains the safe, convenient, world-class venue you have come to expect. Please know that we are working hard to protect your guest experience.

### **Small parks and no play for Diridon?**

Hear all about proposals for Diridon Station Area Plan from Parks staff at our joint meeting with DANG--a coalition of four neighborhoods surrounding Diridon Station Area.

### Monday June 8 at 7 pm via ZOOM

The draft Diridon Station Area Plan is moving towards completion and staff released a video and confusing survey last month. The survey questions focused on service preferences for a community center and nothing about parks. The presentation listed all the things planned for the big community center, but where will the City get money to pay to operate it? Or will it be only for those who can "pay to play?"

The map Google submitted shows some green space, but eliminates the 5-acre park and "green fingers" of the earlier Diridon Area Plan. The Los Gatos Creek trail route on the map is abandoned for an on-street alternative. The park in front of the train station is gone with the new Caltrain Station.

Who will own the green spaces? Who will be allowed to visit? Will it be private like eBay's soccer fields on North First? Or will open space be only for those who can afford to eat in the adjacent restaurants? What if Google abandons the project? Will the green spaces disappear under a new owner's high rise?

The Diridon Station Area plan covers all of the area around the station, not just Google's land. But it seems Google is driving the design. Will there be anywhere OUTSIDE in fresh air that people who live and work there can have

active play?

Even if you don't live near Diridon Station, you'll want to give feedback on this trend. Higher density housing and office buildings are coming throughout the city. Will this serve as a template? No active outdoor space? No public parks?

  - a. <u>SAN JOSE SPOTLIGHT San Jose Diridon Station plan forges ahead as planners adapt to COVID-19 (By Janice Bitters)</u>: Developments across the region may be slowed due to the novel coronavirus, but some of the biggest land use plans in the South Bay are still inching forward, including San Jose's Diridon Station Area Plan and Google's Downtown West project. The two plans were originally set to get a final vote before the end of this year, but that decision has been pushed out to sometime in early 2021, after public, in-person meetings and feedback sessions ground to a halt in March.

### Homelessness: If it's a crisis, lets act like it!

Despite my five-year effort to educate the public and lobby the County Board of Supervisors to implement Laura's law, with the support of my colleagues on the San José City Council, County leaders failed to move this law forward on January 28th.

Laura's Law is a temporary, court-supervised, involuntary conservatorship law that would help some of the most vulnerable mentally ill people on our streets. While it will help a small number of the overall population of unhoused people, that handful are the most severely mentally ill, have had several interactions with law enforcement, and have the biggest effect on our community's quality of life.

Laura's Law has been implemented in neighboring counties and is producing positive outcomes for both the homeless and for taxpayers, and Santa Clara County is missing an opportunity to help those who are unable to get help for themselves.

Despite this disappointment, it was satisfying to see that, after many years without significant, focused action, the County made some progress, such as approving the O'Connor and St. Louise hospitals as clinical service sites for homeless individuals that need medical treatment, and enhancement of mental health services at the Santa Clara Valley Medical Center. County-wide, voters approved Measure A, a \$950 million affordable housing tax, to fund 120 new housing developments in Santa Clara County, including 4,800 units for extremely low-income individuals and families at risk of homelessness.

Concern remains, however, that the County is not looking at quicker, more easily implemented, and less costly ways to house the unhoused. One strategy that San José has utilized is to refurbish older buildings, like the Plaza hotel, into transitional housing. Refurbishing existing spaces is quicker and cheaper than planning, designing, and building new transitional housing. The County previously passed up \$20 million in foundation funds to put with \$50 million in taxpayer funds to help convert the old City Hall Annex building into 150 units of homeless housing and they're now looking to spend twice the money for nearly half the number of beds. I encourage them not to make that mistake again, when it comes to the existing jail structure. Instead of demolishing the building, they should seriously consider remodeling it

@ 20 S Autumn St San Jose, CA 95110 into up to 674 beds for the unhoused. Building 674 beds of new transitional housing elsewhere would cost upwards of \$404 million.

Additionally, the county ought to consider housing uses for the underutilized fairgrounds that have seen three revitalization efforts dating back to 1998 fizzle out (a fourth plan, released back in October, would see it become a "grand public space", but I'm not holding my breath). The county is encouraged to consider buying existing buildings, even new ones, to address the housing crisis more quickly.

Our residents, and our unhoused, deserve a more urgent response to the crisis of homelessness. I call on the County to revisit Laura's Law and to find ways to get people into transitional housing faster, and at a lower cost to taxpayers.

### **Transfer Tax Exemptions**


Measure E - a new real property transfer tax applicable to certain property transactions in San Jose - is on the March 3rd ballot. Information is available at the City Clerk's website on the arguments for and against this measure.

An item to discuss exemptions to the prospective Measure E tax was originally agendized for the February 11th City Council meeting in response to a memo from Mayor Liccardo requesting exemptions for non-profit housing developers. I submitted a memo suggesting that the exemption be extended to all home builders, since the only way to resolve the housing crisis is by increasing the supply of homes at all levels of affordability. At the February 11th meeting, the agenda item was deferred to allow City staff more time to conduct outreach. It is expected to be heard in early March.

### Update on the new (novel) coronavirus



City's new ADU Amnesty Program

Did you construct an accessory dwelling unit (ADU) or convert a garage, basement, or room into a separate living unit — also called an ADU — without obtaining a building permit? Or, did you buy a property with an unpermitted ADU? Insurance companies will NOT cover a fire, damages, or injuries relating to an unpermitted unit. Protect both occupants and yourself by legalizing your unit. The City's new ADU Amnesty Program waives penalties and may help you save more than \$10,000 in fees while you take the steps to legalize your unit, improve the unit's safety for occupants, and reduce your liability. The program allows for using the building codes from the year the unit was built, and provides 5 years to complete items not relating to immediate health and safety issues. You can explore the program without disclosing your name and address by reviewing the Self-Assessment Checklist, and then calling the ADU Amnesty Coordinator with your questions.
