In follow up to our meetings last week, did you find out if the City's water supply numbers need to be considered or referenced in the Utility impact discussion in the EIR?

As a reminder, the numbers in the WSA didn't consider water conservation measures proposed by the project, but those are the numbers used in the capacity analysis for utilities.

The answer to this question affects other sections (e.g., GHGs), so we need to let ESA know ASAP.
