Messages – Google Planned Development Permit application 10-10-2019

Overall Messages

What Google has submitted today is a Planned Development application, and as such, provides a higher level overview of the entire project, not a building-by-building, detailed plan.

we are pleased at the ratio of office to other uses – essentially 1:1, and with a possible 5,000 new housing units, and with the open, interconnected and vibrant nature of the overall Google approach.

The actual application will be publicly posted at www.sanjoaseca.gov/GoogleProject, by 9am 10/11.

Mayor quote: "We appreciate Google's proposal as part of our ongoing efforts to engage our community in reimagining our Western expansion of Downtown, for a broad range of uses anchored by offices and housing. Google continues to demonstrate its commitment to our collective vision of authenticity, lively gathering spaces, respect for the natural environment and strong community engagement."



POSSIBLE QUESTIONS:

When do we see what community benefits the company will provide to residents of the city?

Based on this application, the City will consider zoning changes and other legislative actions that will likely increase the value of Google's investment in the properties they have purchased. That dollar value will then inform the negotiations with Google on a community benefits plan to be included in a Development Agreement. This value will also take into account the feasibility of development. The Memorandum of Understanding between Google and the City is guiding this process. Per Council direction, community input and engagement will be part of this process. City Council will have final decision authority over the Development Agreement and rest of the project components. Outreach will include a presentation to the Station Are Advisory Group on the Draft Development Agreement towards the end of the comprehensive planning process.

• When will we see evidence of activity on the Google project?

Google has already developed plans to activate the historic Colliers Building as project office and for community events, and is planning to start jobs training programs for the community at the Orchard Supply Hardware location on E. San Carlos. More re-uses and pop-ups will be announces as well.
