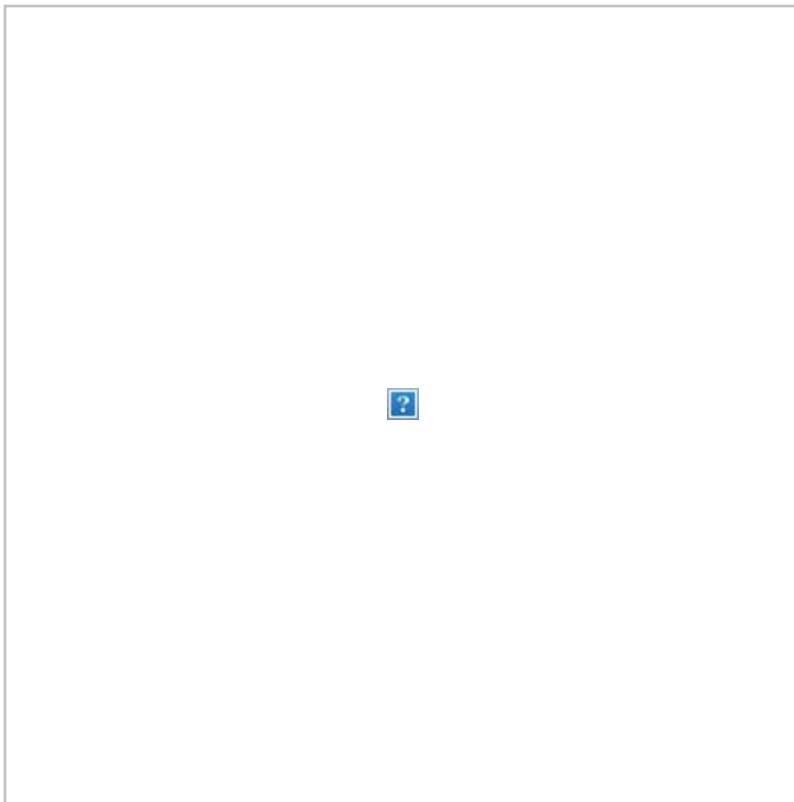

We want this Google development to work for everyone. These demands are what local communities have repeatedly said they need from the deal to sell valuable public land to Google for this mega-campus.

In numerous town hall meetings, surveys, protests and other events, San Jose communities have clearly set out these priorities for this project.
Now it's up to Google to meet them.

We expect Google to provide a glamorous portrayal of the mega-campus – but we need to be clear and say that **unless these crucial tick boxes get ticked, Google's project will not meet the expectations of local communities.**

Google cannot ignore the biggest issues that local communities have about this mega-campus. We need to see a real commitment to housing to prevent displacement, evictions and enormous rent increases. We need to ensure that the people who will be cooking, cleaning, protecting and building the new campus will have a voice on the job. We need to see support for local schools – and we need to make sure the community has oversight of the project.
