Context for Small Business in the DSA

Google MOU

- Shared Goal: Provide opportunities for existing and new small, local businesses to benefit from and/or integrate into the new development.
- "In developing the Community Benefits Plan, consideration will be given to ...Small business opportunity"

Council direction (December 2018): explore [citywide] strategies and financing tools to mitigate small business displacement.

• The outcome was to pilot new approaches in the Alum Rock area.



Initial Observations from Alum Rock

- Planned affordable housing and urban village projects are impacting on sites with existing commercial & retail use.
- Businesses want early notification of planned development to be able to relocate within the neighborhood/city.
- Programs to enhance the physical appearance of sitespecific commercial property seen as minimizing the risk of blight.
- Establishing a Business Improvement District is under active consideration to unify commercial landlord and tenant interests.



Building Resiliency in Alum Rock

- City actively collaborating with local business groups and associations.
- Established links with retail banks, CDFI's and Credit Unions.
- Free access to legal advice through Start Small Think Big & Santa Clara University.
- Reshaped approach to reflect impact of Covid in the neighborhood.
- Next steps include a business survey, designing a virtual incubator, and plans for a new local business center.

Additional Work:

- Examining case studies of similar transit programs
- Conducting outreach to understand access needs adjacent to alignment

- Provide timely information with effective channels of communication to all business in the city.
- Target support for small business i.e. Al fresco, access to capital & technical assistance.
- Collaborate with business groups and associations in neighborhoods most impacted by Covid.
- Supporting unemployed residents to return to work and secure full time employment.



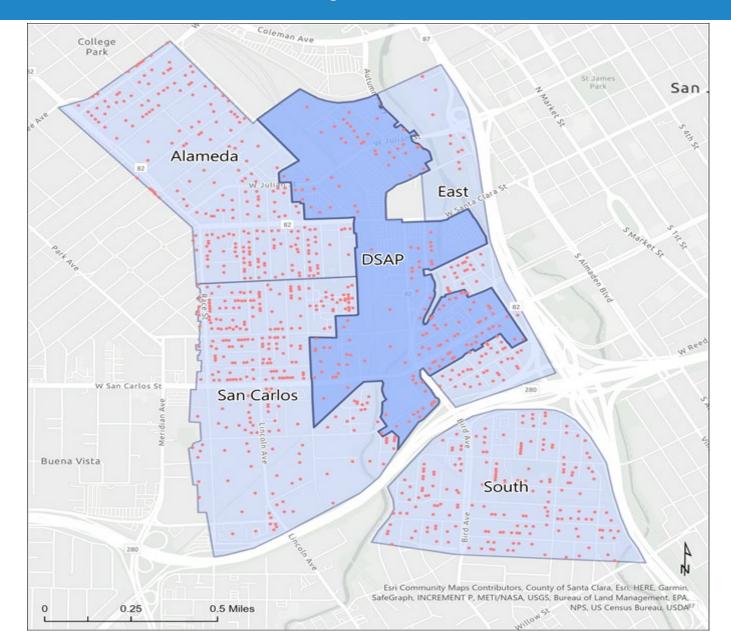

Small Business Context- Key Findings

- There are over 1,750 businesses in the broader study area employing over 7,500 people
- 94% are micro businesses employing with less than 10 employees
- The remaining 6% which are the larger businesses and other organizations employ over 4,900 people some 65% of the total
- 58% are sole proprietor businesses, many of which areocated in residential property and single family neighborhoods
- 26% of businesses identify as retail, restaurant, or personal service sectors.
