Hi Scott and Gina,

Please find some points on Downtown West microgrid below.

- To improve electric reliability and resiliency, City of San Jose has studied evaluating and establishing microgrids and City provided electric service in areas of new development, including a development project west of downtown San Jose proposed by Google.
- City is studying providing electric service to the development (generation and distribution). Transmission to the development would be provided by PG&E. So far, City has found this would be:
 - Legal: City has clear legal and regulatory path to provide electric service to the development.
 - Lower rates for customers: Electric service provided by the City including infrastructure costs –would be about 20% lower as a base case compared to the cost to obtain retail service from PG&E
- Would allow the City and the developer to better work together to advance a shared interest in building an advanced microgrid with on-site renewable generation and energy storage, thus making the energy service more reliable, clean, and resilient
 - Would benefit the City: City and the developer would be able to design the microgrid to provide power to critical loads during PG&E power shutoffs (planned and unplanned)
