**Project Description:** General Plan Amendment, Planned Development Rezoning, Planned Development Permit, Vesting Tentative Map, Development Agreement and other land use related approvals for the development of up to 5,900 residential units; up to 7,300,000 gross square feet (GSF) of office space; up to 500,000 GSF of active uses such as retail, cultural, arts, etc.; up to 300 hotel rooms; up to 800 limited-term corporate accommodations; up to two

event and conference centers totaling up to 100,000 GSF; up to two central utility plants totaling approximately 130,000 GSF; logistics/warehouse(s) totaling approximately 100,000 GSF; and approximately 15 acres of open space, all on approximately 80 acres. The project also proposes infrastructure, transportation, and public realm improvements. **Location:** The Project site is generally bounded by Lenzen Avenue and the Union Pacific Railroad tracks to the north; North Montgomery Street, Los Gatos Creek, the Guadalupe River, South Autumn Street, and Royal Avenue to the east; Auzerais Avenue to the south; and Diridon Station and the Caltrain rail line to the west. The project also includes the area bounded by Los Gatos Creek to the west, West San Fernando Street to the south, the Guadalupe River to the east, and West Santa Clara Street to the north.



We are pleased to announce that we have posted the staff-recommended Draft Development Agreement for Google's Downtown West project <a href="here">here</a>.

This marks a key milestone for the project, following adoption of a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) in 2018, application submittal in 2019, and release of the Draft Environmental Impact Report (DEIR) and Downtown West Design Standards and Guidelines (DWDSG) in 2020.

The Draft Development Agreement addresses the Council's top priorities and other topics important to the SAAG and community, as expressed in 2018 and reinforced through extensive community engagement since then. It includes \$200M in community benefits and more than \$1B in project features. If approved by City Council, it will govern how Google builds its Downtown West project, including office, residential, commercial, cultural, open space, and parkland uses, and will establish a new fund to address community stabilization and opportunity pathways.

The Draft Development Agreement will be the main topic of the next SAAG meeting on April 14, 2021 at 6pm and a Community Meeting on April 17, 2021 at 10am. There will be Spanish and Vietnamese interpretation available at both meetings. Community members may also submit questions and comments through an online form. Staff will provide all comments received to the Planning Commission and City Council for consideration. The public hearing process is targeted for later this spring (tentatively April 28 and May 25 for Planning Commission and City Council respectively).
