As you may have heard, today we <u>announced</u> an additional \$1 billion investment—our biggest yet—in housing in the Bay Area.

We are one of the largest employers in the Bay Area. Over the years, we have participated in many conversations with stakeholders, elected officials, and community members about the lack of supply of housing units. As we continue to be thoughtful and intentional in engaging the community, we've heard local government and the community loud and clear: we need to do more.
